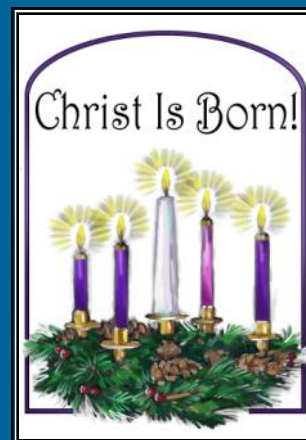

As the new year dawns, let us make a resolution to be more committed in growing in our faith, renewing our baptismal covenant with God, and living that promise of letting our light shine for the whole world to see.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *by Bruce Smith*

Let me start out by saying I wish you all a blessed Advent, then Christmas season. It should be everything we as Christians need, as it's the birth of our Savior. What could be more joyous for us all? Make time to pray for Peace in our world, that the hungry be fed, that the homeless be given shelter, and that those seeking employment find jobs that glorify our God.



For the past three months we have been a busy mission church. In September we hosted a Charity golf tournament called Golf for the Missions 2, which supported Opportunity House and Vaca FISH, the Rio Vista Community Services program, and the Epiphany Episcopal "feed the hungry" project in which we participate. This charity event netted proceeds of \$5,636 that were divided between these charities.

On the day our pumpkins arrived we hosted a charity concert at our church. What a fitting beginning for the Pumpkins on the Hill event. The concert netted proceeds of \$1,115 which were divided between debt reduction and the Epiphany Episcopal project.

Then for the next two weeks many of us endured a soggy pumpkin patch, at times, all in the name of feeding the hungry of Vacaville. What a calling! I cannot believe the rallying support this event received this year. You all provided cakes, jams, T-shirts, photos, artistic talents, and endless smiling faces. Those that worked the patch connected with each other and our community on a level unattainable by just going to church on Sunday. That's part of the magic of the Patch. God is in our patch spreading his endless love for us all. The great news is your efforts netted another \$2,478 with the proceeds divided between Opportunity House and the Epiphany Episcopal project.

Then right after the Pumpkin Patch closed the gate, we hosted the annual Harvest Fest fund raising dinner 2011 Vacation Bible School. On top of a record crowd attending (over 160) we had an immensely good time and gathered another approximate \$3,000. Your efforts contributed a combined \$8,672 that will directly go to feeding hungry individuals and families in our community, \$3000 that will spread God's word of love and

hope next summer to the children of our congregation and our community, and another \$557 that helped drop our loan balance. I see that as amazing, and evident that Christ is very active in our "small" church.



Speaking of small, have you noticed the number of individuals and families worshipping at church the past couple of Sundays? Our numbers are increasing, so our message of Christ being active in our church is slowly gathering momentum. I'm sure that is how it must have for the apostles when they went out into the countryside sharing the good news of Christ in our world. Please make as much room as possible, that we all may find a seat in church on Sunday.



Finally, let me answer a question I've been fielding lately. "Are our finances getting better?" When you look at the financial snapshot in the Sunday bulletin, it gives you the impression that finally we must have turned a corner. There are more people in church and no negative financial numbers in the bulletin. Let me say, I believe we are turning a corner, but don't let the numbers give us a false sense of security. Over the past two months we have had a considerable intake of funds. Not all of these are our offerings and tithes. A lot are proceeds from the month's events and these proceeds have not yet been disbursed to the charities, but will be soon. There are a lot of unpaid expenses as well; and these too will be paid by the end of November. We also have not paid back the \$7,200 that was advanced against the American River loan back in July. So don't let the numbers mislead you, things could be better. We are still on track with our approved budget, but remember, we knew back in May we would be stretching over this fiscal year.

I thank you all for your support and your dedication to our Savior, Jesus Christ. May his light and love continue to shine on us, that we may be his beacons for the world this Advent and Christmas season.

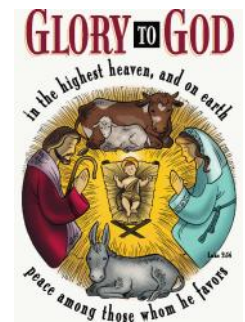

In our readings for this season we will see a change of sorts. The first Sunday (November 28) centers on Christ's return. The second and third Sundays in Advent (Dec. 5 & 12) focus our attention on John the Baptizer, while the Fourth Sunday calls to mind the role of Mary and Joseph as obedient servants chosen to raise God's anointed one.

Of course all this moves us to the Christmas celebration, which will begin on **Christmas Eve, Thursday, December 24<sup>th</sup>**. We will continue our tradition of three services that evening:

**The 5:30 p.m. service will be a service of Candles and Carols**

**The 7:30 p.m. and 9:30 p.m. services will include Candles, Carols and Communion**

I hope to see you at one of these worship services.

**Another note: on the two Sundays after Christmas – December 26 and January 2 – we will hold a single worship service at 9:30 a.m.** The service will be filled with Christmas carols, and of course, Communion.

## EDUCATION TEAM NEWS *By Cindy Ward, Team Leader*

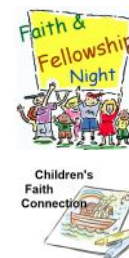

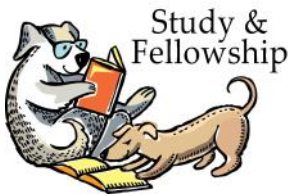


## SMALL GROUPS NEWS *by Small Group Leader Jacquie Smith*
